Students also need a support to stay motivated, so we will continue to recognize students for positive behaviors through the PBIS and MTSS supports in our school. We are also becoming more targeted in identifying the students that need to grow the most. We will look at the lowest 25% and the 'bubble kids' for both proficiency and SGP and make plans on helping them.
